Dates for your Dairy

New Portrait & Still Life Group, Sunday morning painting. March 30th, April 20th, May 25th, June 29th and July 27th.

As new members have pointed out to us, there are scant opportunities to socialise in the society. With this in mind, we have arranged to hire the light and airy room in Darwin Hall for monthly painting sessions. They will run from 10am until 1pm, with a half hour permitted setting up period beforehand and again allowing a half hour to clear up.

The hall has a great kitchen area, ideal for preparing refreshments for our half time breaks, and newly refurbished toilet facilities. There is a good parking area for approximately 25 vehicles, with Waitrose adjacent for any overspill. We would also have the use of a substantial private grassed area for those who wish to paint outside.

I propose to split the room into two areas, at one end six small tables will accommodate still life items with a larger table before each one for two persons. I'd like this in a circle, the other end will be for portraiture, and for the first session we will have the Town Cryer in full regalia.

Feel free to circulate and look at each other's work, this is a social event after all. You are also not limited to working on the sets, bring your own projects along if you wish. The Still Life tables. If you have any interesting items, we would like to include them, and we would appreciate your contributions for the settings. We will need, tablecloths (small), flowers (in pots or vases). (fruit and veg (dish or bowl), ceramics (pots or figurines), glass and fabrics. Miscellaneous items, such as tools, shoes, clocks etc...Please bring them a little early (before 10am) for set up.

Portrait. We have a model for March but if you can recommend other suitable persons (not children!) i.e., Historical re-enactment persons, attractive young (or ancient!) persons, anyone willing to sit still for two hours, let us know.

As at Saxon Hill, we will charge a small fee at half time to cover costs. Currently set at £3.00 per person.
